EPIS is divided into 4 EPIS branches:

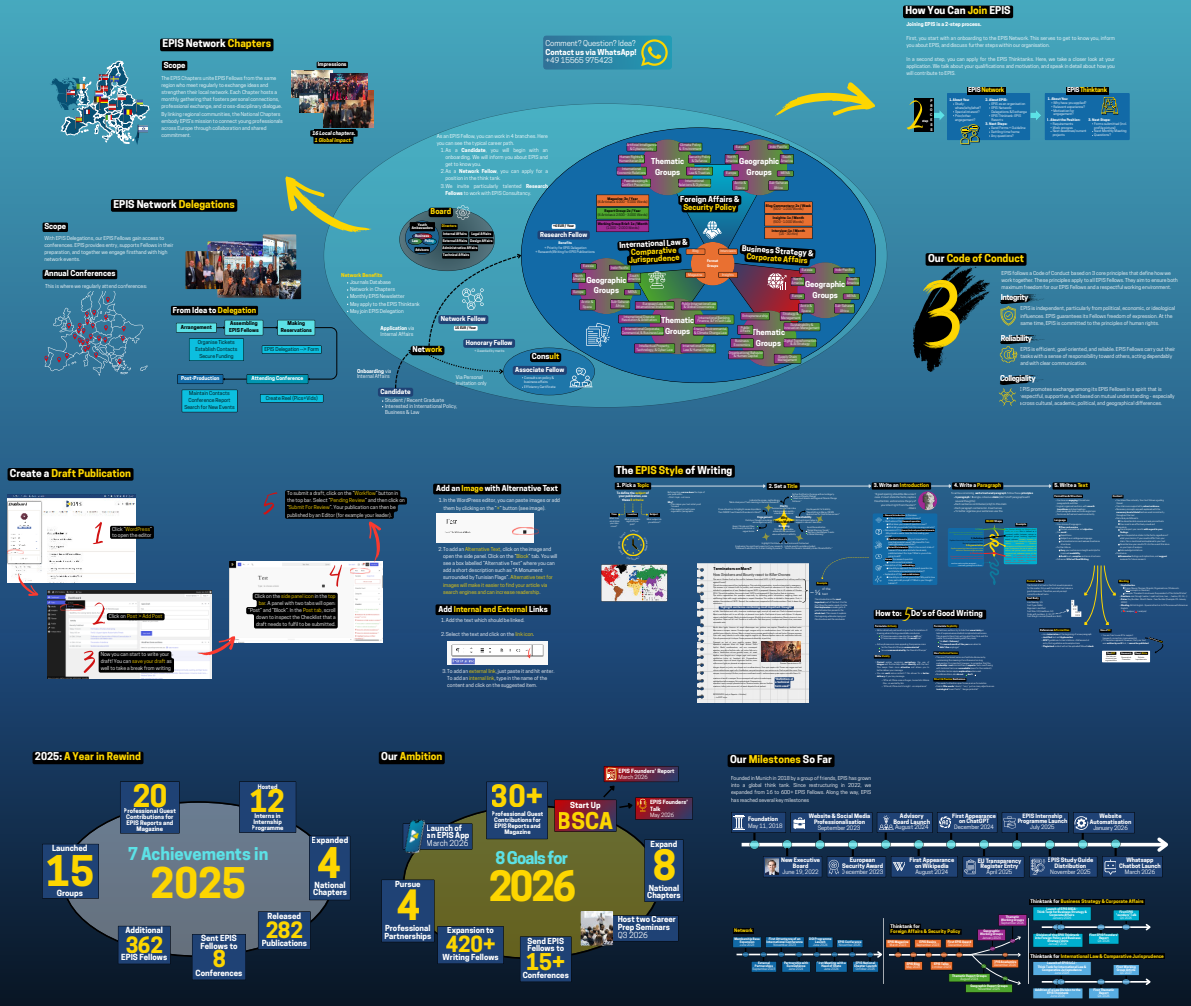
- Consultancy for industry & academia
